

THEME FOR TODAY

When we speak of the offices of Christ Jesus, we are referring to the roles that he undertakes as our Savior for our benefit. In particular, these offices are a reference to the positions God instituted in Old Testament times in order to minister to his people. In those times, God anointed prophets to speak his word; priests to offer sacrifices for his people; and kings to lead his people. The Old Testament also spoke of God's special anointed one, his Messiah (or Christ), as being someone who would fulfill the roles of these offices. Indeed, the Old Testament scriptures foretold that Jesus would be our prophet, priest, and king—teaching us God's word, interceding for us, and ruling all things for our good. This advent season we will take a look at prophecies foretelling each of Jesus' offices.

Amen.


Lord's Prayer
