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### **WELCOME!**

### THEME FOR TODAY

"Ministry" simply means "service." Throughout history, God has called individuals to serve God's people by sharing God's Word. Many today feel they do not need to be part of a church and do not need Christian preaching and teaching. "I can be a believer without any of that." Yet clearly, Jesus himself believes ministry is necessary. That is why he gave some to pastors, teachers, missionaries, etc. to share his gospel. We call it "holy ministry" because the Holy Spirit does his work through his ministers. As ministers proclaim God's Word, the Spirit unleashes his power. We also call it "holy ministry" because through gospel ministry our faith is sustained, which is what makes us holy in God's eyes. Our worship for the next three weeks expands upon this topic of the holy ministry.

Today we are reminded that the holy ministry is not filled with perfect people. The holy ministry is filled with sinners whom God has called out of his boundless mercy. Look at Moses, who, in a fit of anger he killed a man, then later told the LORD he was not a good enough speaker to lead the Israelites, yet God called him to ministry. The Apostle Paul persecuted followers of The Way, yet God in his grace called him to minister as missionary to the Gentiles. Matthew was a tax collector yet, Jesus called him to be one of the twelve. God forgave them all their sins and set them apart (sanctified) for gospel ministry.

The holy ministry is God's gift to the Church. But it is also God's gift to ministers, who certainly do not deserve the privilege of being God's public servants. God calls sinful and weak individuals into the ministry, so that as his kingdom advances, we give credit where credit is due—to the Holy Spirit. Indeed it is the Holy Spirit, who sanctifies (makes holy) that makes the ministry truly a holy ministry.



First Reading Exodus 3:1–15

Moses asked a good question: "Who am I to bring the Israelites out of Egypt." Answer: the one the LORD himself had chosen for that holy ministry.

¹Now Moses was tending the flock of Jethro his father-in-law, the priest of Midian, and he led the flock to the far side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. ²There the angel of the LORD appeared to him in flames of fire from within a bush. Moses saw that though the bush was on fire it did not burn up. ³So Moses thought, "I will go over and see this strange sight—why the bush does not burn up."

<sup>4</sup>When the LORD saw that he had gone over to look, God called to him from within the bush, "Moses! Moses!"

And Moses said, "Here I am."

<sup>5</sup>"Do not come any closer," God said. "Take off your sandals, for the place where you are standing is holy ground." <sup>6</sup>Then he said, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob." At this, Moses hid his face, because he was afraid to look at God.

<sup>7</sup>The LORD said, "I have indeed seen the misery of my people in Egypt. I have heard them crying out because of their slave drivers, and I am concerned about their suffering. <sup>8</sup>So I have come down to rescue them from the hand of the Egyptians and to bring them up out of that land into a good and spacious land, a land flowing with milk and honey—the home of the Canaanites, Hittites, Amorites, Perizzites, Hivites and Jebusites. <sup>9</sup>And now the cry of the Israelites has reached me, and I have seen the way the Egyptians are oppressing them. <sup>10</sup>So now, go. I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people the Israelites out of Egypt."

<sup>11</sup>But Moses said to God, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?"

<sup>12</sup>And God said, "I will be with you. And this will be the sign to you that it is I who have sent you: When you have brought the people out of Egypt, you will worship God on this mountain."

<sup>13</sup>Moses said to God, "Suppose I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' Then what shall I tell them?"

 $^{14}$ God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: 'I AM has sent me to you.'"

<sup>15</sup>God also said to Moses, "Say to the Israelites, 'The LORD, the God of your fathers—the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob—has sent me to you.'



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# **Second Reading**

1 Timothy 1:12-17

To demonstrate mercy and patience, God called Paul, the self-identified "worst of sinners," into the holy ministry.

<sup>12</sup>I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who has given me strength, that he considered me trustworthy, appointing me to his service. <sup>13</sup>Even though I was once a blasphemer and a persecutor and a violent man, I was shown mercy because I acted in ignorance and unbelief. <sup>14</sup>The grace of our Lord was poured out on me abundantly, along with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus.

<sup>15</sup>Here is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the worst. <sup>16</sup>But for that very reason I was shown mercy so that in me, the worst of sinners, Christ Jesus might display his immense patience as an example for those who would believe in him and receive eternal life. <sup>17</sup>Now to the King eternal, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen.
