JULY WORSHIP SERIES

I believe. Those are the first words we speak when we say the Apostle's creed. We express our belief by our church membership. We confess our belief by going to church. Indeed, we confess that we believe in God, and in Jesus as our Savior, when we dutifully manage our household, love our neighbor, do our jobs faithfully as we would for the Lord. Yet, it's not always easy, is it? What we confess to believe; what we say we are; what we want to be—it's not always what we are, at least not completely. The Apostle Paul expressed the struggle of a sinner living by faith vividly when he said, "I do not do the good I want to do, but the evil I do not want to do—this I keep on doing...What a wretched man I am! Who will rescue me from this body that is subject to death?" But he also concludes those remarks by saying: "Thanks be to God, who delivers me through Jesus Christ our Lord!"

That is what makes real Christianity different from any other religion or philosophy. That is what separates true faith from teaching that only appears to be Christian or only claims to have its authority from the Bible and Christ but does not truly have it. God's word is real about life. It's real about faith. It's real and honest because it is the truth. The truth is that you're not perfect, you're not going to make yourself perfect, and you definitely better not pretend that you're perfect. Still, you do need perfection. It must come from somewhere else, though. And so, it does. It comes from God. It comes from a substitute. A Savior. That Savior is Jesus. That's where this truth that gives real lessons about life and faith ends up: pointing you to Christ for the faith needed to believe and receive all that is promised through him.

This summer worship series will help us get real about faith: to see what it really means to be a Christian, but to remind us that it's not about us simply believing better. It's about grace and constantly remembering that we are saved by grace. This faith is God's gift of grace. "For it is by Grace you have been saved, through faith—and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast." (Ephesians 2:8-9)

THEME FOR TODAY

Faith trusts that God is Enough — Sometimes we speak as if having God is our poverty line. Sure, we could get by as long as we only had him, but we certainly wouldn't dream of living that way! How small that makes God! God is everything for us and not merely just a bare minimum. The problem is, it's not just that our sinful nature gets greedy when we see how much the world has to offer. The reality is that we are born into this world and this world is what we know. So even if we are not greedy, our eyes simply are not attuned to seeing spiritually. We need to be taught to see spiritually. Since we are in many ways just spiritual beginners, the trust we have that God is enough can often be a very fragile trust. Yet, God by his grace leads us to see that he is indeed enough, especially when we face that greatest unknown: death. If God is enough for us in death, he certainly is enough for us now in this life. Indeed, God is everything for us, now and into eternity!

THE LORD'S SUPPER


Scripture teaches us that in the Lord's Supper:

- The body and blood of Christ are really present with the bread and the wine. (Matthew 26:26-28; 1 Corinthians 11:27)
- Jesus gives true forgiveness, not just a symbol, to each recipient. (Matthew 26:28)
- We are united as one body of believers because we all partake the one body and blood of Christ. "Is not the cup of thanksgiving for which we give thanks a participation in the blood of Christ? And is not the bread that we break a participation in the body of Christ? Because there is one loaf, we, who are many, are one body, for we all share the one loaf. (1 Corinthians 10:16-17)

For these reasons we ask that, if you are not a part of a WELS (Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod) or ELS (Evangelical Lutheran Synod) church that publicly confesses to believe these same scriptural truths, you speak with our pastor before you take the Sacrament. We do not wish to judge your faith, but want to make sure that we are in agreement before publicly declaring that we share a common faith.

We are careful about the way we celebrate the Lord's Supper because we want to humbly accept this gift the way God intended.

This Sunday we will go back to the "old way" of communion distribution when you approach the front of the church. Instead of spreading out across the entire front of church, please come to the area along the edge of the step between the pulpit and lectern (the area designated by the checked box in the diagram). The ushers will help to guide you in doing this.

For the peace of the whole world, for the well-being of the Church of God, and for the unity of all, let us pray to the Lord.



First Reading Exodus 32:15–29

Aaron's feeble excuses for why the Israelites fell into idolatry remind us of our own shallow rationalizations for failing to love God above all things.

¹⁵Moses turned and went down the mountain with the two tablets of the covenant law in his hands. They were inscribed on both sides, front and back. ¹⁶The tablets were the work of God; the writing was the writing of God, engraved on the tablets.

¹⁷When Joshua heard the noise of the people shouting, he said to Moses, "There is the sound of war in the camp."

¹⁸Moses replied:

"It is not the sound of victory, it is not the sound of defeat; it is the sound of singing that I hear."

¹⁹When Moses approached the camp and saw the calf and the dancing, his anger burned and he threw the tablets out of his hands, breaking them to pieces at the foot of the mountain. ²⁰And he took the calf the people had made and burned it in the fire; then he ground it to powder, scattered it on the water and made the Israelites drink it.

²¹He said to Aaron, "What did these people do to you, that you led them into such great sin?"

²²"Do not be angry, my lord," Aaron answered. "You know how prone these people are to evil. ²³They said to me, 'Make us gods who will go before us. As for this fellow Moses who brought us up out of Egypt, we don't know what has happened to him.' ²⁴So I told them, 'Whoever has any gold jewelry, take it off.' Then they gave me the gold, and I threw it into the fire, and out came this calf!"

²⁵Moses saw that the people were running wild and that Aaron had let them get out of control and so become a laughingstock to their enemies. ²⁶So he stood at the entrance to the camp and said, "Whoever is for the LORD, come to me." And all the Levites rallied to him.

²⁷Then he said to them, "This is what the LORD, the God of Israel, says: 'Each man strap a sword to his side. Go back and forth through the camp from one end to the other, each killing his brother and friend and neighbor.' " ²⁸The Levites did as Moses commanded, and that day about three thousand of the people died. ²⁹Then Moses said, "You have been set apart to the LORD today, for you were against your own sons and brothers, and he has blessed you this day."

Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called when you made your good confession in the presence of many witnesses. ¹³In the sight of God, who gives life to everything, and of Christ Jesus, who while testifying before Pontius Pilate made the good confession, I charge you ¹⁴to keep this command without spot or blame until the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ, ¹⁵which God will bring about in his own time—God, the blessed and only Ruler, the King of kings and Lord of lords, ¹⁶who alone is immortal and who lives in unapproachable light, whom no one has seen or can see. And also with you.


Lift up your hearts.
