This week we examine the contrast of betrayal and faithfulness in the light of the cross. How does a faithful God deal with people who have turned their backs on him? The answer is found in the cross!




PRAYER AT THE CLOSE OF DAY

Compline: Setting II



Forgive us in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Deliver and restore us, that we may rest in peace.




[G]: Amen.
