THEME FOR TODAY

Traditionally the fourth Sunday after Easter is Good Shepherd Sunday. On a number of occasions, Jesus referred to himself as a shepherd, indicating his care and concern for all his people. He even called himself the Good Shepherd, differentiating himself from those who do not properly care for the sheep. This Easter season we learn that Jesus lives to shepherd us. He directs us, provides for us, and protects us. "For 'you were like sheep going astray,' but now you have returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls." Apart from Jesus we wander and will only find danger and destruction. With Jesus, even though we may suffer for doing good, no one can truly harm us. Just as Christ triumphed though he suffered, so too, we triumph with him.

For the peace from above and for our salvation, let us pray to the Lord. **Lord, have mercy.**





First Reading Acts 2:42–47

The early Church was marked by devotion to apostolic teaching and genuine love for one another. And the Good Shepherd's flock grew.

⁴²They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. ⁴³Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. ⁴⁴All the believers were together and had everything in common. ⁴⁵They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. ⁴⁶Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, ⁴⁷praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

Second Reading 1 Peter 2:19–25

St. Peter calls us to follow our Shepherd and Overseer, even if it means that we suffer for doing good.

¹⁹For it is commendable if someone bears up under the pain of unjust suffering because they are conscious of God. ²⁰But how is it to your credit if you receive a beating for doing wrong and endure it? But if you suffer for doing good and you endure it, this is commendable before God. ²¹To this you were called, because Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in his steps.

²²"He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth."

²³When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly. ²⁴"He himself bore our sins" in his body on the cross, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness; "by his wounds you have been healed." ²⁵For "you were like sheep going astray," but now you have returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls.

Gospel John 10:1–10

Jesus is not only our Good Shepherd. He is the gate through which we enter into the green pastures of salvation.

¹"Very truly I tell you Pharisees, anyone who does not enter the sheep pen by the gate, but climbs in by some other way, is a thief and a robber. ²The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. ³The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep listen to his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. ⁴When he has brought out all his own, he goes on ahead of them, and his sheep follow him because they know his voice. ⁵But they will never follow a stranger; in fact, they will run away from him because they do not recognize a stranger's voice." ⁶Jesus used this figure of speech, but the Pharisees did not understand what he was telling them.

⁷Therefore Jesus said again, "Very truly I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. ⁸All who have come before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep have not listened to them. ⁹I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved. They will come in and go out, and find pasture. ¹⁰The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.
