



THE WORD

FIRST READING Ezekiel 2:1-3:4

Ezekiel was the Lord's spokesman to stubborn and rebellious Israel. He was to say what the Lord told him even though he would be hated for his message. Ezekiel's experience is not the exception but the paradigm. Faithful preaching points clearly to the problem of sin and then ushers the sinner to the foot of the cross of Jesus; the only hope and comfort of salvation. This was the kind of preaching Ezekiel was called to deliver. It is what every minister of Christ is called to do.

He said to me, "Son of man, stand up on your feet and I will speak to you." ² As he spoke, the Spirit came into me and raised me to my feet, and I heard him speaking to me.

³ He said: "Son of man, I am sending you to the Israelites, to a rebellious nation that has rebelled against me; they and their ancestors have been in revolt against me to this very day. ⁴ The people to whom I am sending you are obstinate and stubborn. Say to them, 'This is what the Sovereign LORD says.' ⁵ And whether they listen or fail to listen—for they are a rebellious people—they will know that a prophet has been among them. ⁶ And you, son of man, do not be afraid of them or their words. Do not be afraid, though briers and thorns are all around you and you live among scorpions. Do not be afraid of what they say or be terrified by them, though they are a rebellious people. ⁷ You must speak my words to them, whether they listen or fail to listen, for they are rebellious. ⁸ But you, son of man, listen to what I say to you. Do not rebel like that rebellious people; open your mouth and eat what I give you."

⁹ Then I looked, and I saw a hand stretched out to me. In it was a scroll, ¹⁰ which he unrolled before me. On both sides of it were written words of lament and mourning and woe.

¹ And he said to me, "Son of man, eat what is before you, eat this scroll; then go and speak to the people of Israel." ² So I opened my mouth, and he gave me the scroll to eat.

³ Then he said to me, "Son of man, eat this scroll I am giving you and fill your stomach with it." So I ate it, and it tasted as sweet as honey in my mouth.

⁴ He then said to me: "Son of man, go now to the people of Israel and speak my words to them.





O LORD, hear my prayer, listen to my cry for <u>mer</u>cy;* in your faithfulness and righteousness come to my relief.

Do not bring your servant into <u>judg</u>ment,* for no one living is righteous before you.

SECOND READING

2 Corinthians 12:7-10

There is danger for God's preacher to think more of himself then he should because of his calling, even to the point of losing his salvation while saving others. Paul knew such temptations. Here he speaks of the "thorn in the flesh" given to him to keep him from sinful pride. It served to keep God's grace in Christ Jesus the center of his attention and not the great revelations he had received from the Lord.

Therefore, in order to keep me from becoming conceited, I was given a thorn in my flesh, a messenger of Satan, to torment me. ⁸ Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take it away from me. ⁹ But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. ¹⁰ That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong.

GOSPEL Mark 6:1-6

Hostility to Jesus' message is nothing surprising, but it is surprising from people who are expected to know better. Such discouragement can be a stumbling block to the faithful. Only the Word and reliance on it gets us past that stumbling block. Jesus promised such rejection, yet that does not diminish the magnitude of the message.

Jesus left there and went to his hometown, accompanied by his disciples. ² When the Sabbath came, he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were amazed.

"Where did this man get these things?" they asked. "What's this wisdom that has been given him? What are these remarkable miracles he is performing? ³ Isn't this the carpenter? Isn't this Mary's son and the brother of James, Joseph, Judas and Simon? Aren't his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him.

⁴ Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not without honor except in his own town, among his relatives and in his own home." ⁵ He could not do any miracles there, except lay his hands on a few sick people and heal them. ⁶ He was amazed at their lack of faith.


LORD'S PRAYER


